## General Order Continuing Misdemeanor Dockets March 16, 2020 Through April 30, 2020

## **ORDER**

On March 12, 2020, the court entered General Order No. 2020-01 outlining certain measures taken in response to exigent circumstances created by the outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). Specifically, the General Order directed that beginning March 16, 2020, and continuing until April 30, 2020, all misdemeanor, traffic, and petty offense dockets in each division of the court be continued to new dates. After conferring with the U.S. Attorney's office and the issuing authorities, the magistrate judges of the Norfolk and Newport News Divisions confirmed new dates for each affected docket. Accordingly, for the reasons stated in the General Order, all matters set for such dockets in Norfolk and Newport News are CONTINUED as follows:

citations for initial appearance on any of the affected docket dates in March or April.

The Clerk is directed to distribute this Order to the United States Attorney's Office, the

Federal Public Defender's Office, and the United States Probation Office in both the Norfolk and

Newport News Divisions. The Order shall also be posted on the court's website.
