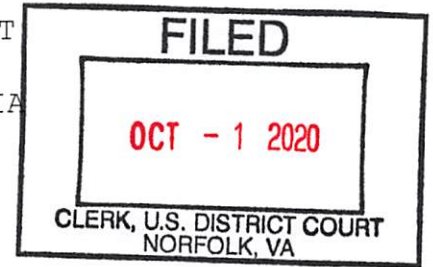

**CJA COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT ORDER**

On November 6, 2019, the Judicial Council of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit approved the Criminal Justice Act Plan ("CJA Plan") for the Eastern District of Virginia. Section VIII(A)(1) of the CJA Plan provides that the Court, in consultation with the Federal Public Defender, shall appoint three divisional CJA Committees that shall consist of one district judge, one magistrate judge, one federal public defender attorney, two CJA Panel attorneys and an *ex officio* staff member employed by the Clerk's Office. By order of December 18, 2019, a copy of which is attached, the Court appointed divisional CJA Committees across the district for three year terms. In the Richmond Division, the Court initially appointed United States Magistrate Judge Roderick C. Young and CJA attorney Amy L. Austin to serve on the committee. However, in light of Judge Young's elevation and Ms. Austin's change of practice, effective immediately, the CJA Committee shall consist of the following members in the Richmond division:

The new members, Judge Hanes and Mr. Gavin, will serve three year terms from the date of this order. The terms of the remaining members shall run from the date of original appointment.

The Clerk shall provide a copy of this Order to all District Judges and Magistrate Judges in the Richmond Division, the Federal Public Defender and all CJA Panel attorneys for the Richmond Division, as well as post the Order on the Court's website.
